Candace began this business as a side hustle. She sells soaps and other bath products. All are zero waste. The soaps are wrapped only in seed paper that can be planted to grow wildflowers.

She also makes a shampoo bar. Think of all the plastic shampoo bottle garbage that could prevent!



REFILL Market

Everything is sold by the gram so customers bring in their clean & dry containers to be refilled with a lot or a little product.
